The Reluctant Saint (1962) stars Maximilian Schell as Saint Joseph of Cupertino, a 17th-century Franciscan friar whose proneness to miraculous levitations is honored in his patronage of air travel. (Famously slow-witted, he is also patron of mental handicaps and students.) The film is a gently humorous celebration of Franciscan simplicity, poverty of spirit and love of nature and animals. Though reverent and grave, it is lighter and earthier than other pious Hollywood Golden Age fare, able to laugh both at its protagonist and even more at his formidable mother, the terror of every man who knows her.

Ricardo Montalban plays the antagonist, a learned but proud Franciscan offended by the divine favor bestowed on this holy fool, even ascribing his miracles to diabolical influence. The film includes perhaps the first extensive Hollywood depiction of an exorcism ritual — an exorcism that fails, of course, since Joseph isn't possessed! [review from www.decentfilms.com]



JOB OPENING – LIVE-IN AIDE

Jubilee Association provides support services to people who have intellectual and other developmental disabilities, helping them live in community settings and pursue their goals and dreams.

We are looking for a support staff to live with and assist two young men who are in the exciting life transition of moving into their own apartment. It is a three bedroom, two bathroom condo in Rockville Town Center, close to the town square, Metro, movie theatre, Dawson's Market, and lots of dining and shopping options. *The condo has a master suite with private bath and so the position could be filled by either a male or female.*

The staff will help the men adjust to their new environment and assist with duties like managing household finances, grocery shopping, setting up or helping the guys set up the systems to run the home, ensuring house cleaning, assisting with planning meals and cooking, medical appointments, getting them to their social activities if they want that assistance, and other duties as needed.

This position starts late Sunday evening and is split shift Monday through Friday mornings and Monday, Tuesday Thursday evenings 2-8 p.m. As you will be making the condo your home, it is expected you will be sleeping there except for times you make arrangements with your supervisor to travel. The actual schedule in more detail is:

- Monday, 6a-noon, 2-8p
- Tuesday, 6-10a, 2-8p
- Wednesday, 6a-noon
- Thursday, 6-10a, 2-8p
- Friday, 6:30-9:30a
